What's in Your Hand?

The LORD said to him, "What is that in your hand?" And he said, "A staff." –Exodus 4:2

I will address our primary text from Exodus later, but first I must surround it with context for the upcoming year.

I have already heard several thoughts of encouragement for this coming year and, I must say, they have all been extremely encouraging. In fact, they have been like a refreshing spring compared to the "doom and gloom" being propagated by many Christian leaders. This may be review for some of you but it bears repeating...

Over twenty years ago, even before I had much understanding of the "ever increasing glory" (II Corinthians 3:18 NIV) that will usher in the long awaited harvest in the earth, the Lord spoke the following words to my heart; "There are two sides to the glory cloud." He then went on to download an understanding of this into my spirit. There will be the side of judgement, which will be dark and gloomy, but for those of God's choice servants (those who have chosen to yield all and walk in close communion with their Lord), the other side will be glorious, ushering in the Grand Finale they have waited for and been prepared for their entire lives!

The perfect biblical example of the two sides of the glory cloud is the cloud that separated the Israelites from the ensuing Egyptian army during their exodus from Egypt. The brilliant side of that cloud was a cloud of protection from the heat by day, and provided light and warmth during the night. God then used the great darkness of the other side of the cloud to judge Egypt, as the Egyptian army chased the Israelites into the midst of the Red Sea. With the great cloud of glory stopping the army's advance, the entire Egyptian army was destroyed as God released the walls of water causing its destruction.

In reflection for the New Year, another important point worth repeating is the promises of scripture that never change no matter what our view of the end times. Such promises as:

*For the eyes of the LORD move to and fro throughout the earth that He may strongly support those whose heart is completely His.
—II Chronicles 16:9a*

*And we know that God causes all things to work together for good to those who love God, to those who are called according to His purpose. For those whom He foreknew, He also predestined to become conformed to the image of His Son, so that He would be the firstborn among many brethren; and these whom He predestined, He also called; and these whom He called, He also justified; and these whom He justified, He also glorified. What then shall we say to these things? If God is for us, who is against us? He who did not spare His own Son, but delivered Him over for us all, how will He not also with Him freely give us all things?
—Romans 8:28-32*

To me, the very least of all saints, this grace was given, to preach to the Gentiles the unfathomable riches of Christ, and to bring to light what is the administration of the mystery which for ages has been hidden in God who created all things; so that

*the manifold wisdom of God might now be made known through the church to the rulers and the authorities in the heavenly places.
—Ephesians 3:8-10*

Yet we do speak wisdom among those who are mature; a wisdom, however, not of this age nor of the rulers of this age, who are passing away; but we speak God's wisdom in a mystery, the hidden wisdom which God predestined before the ages to our glory; the wisdom which none of the rulers of this age has understood; for if they had understood it they would not have crucified the Lord of glory; but just as it is written, "THINGS WHICH EYE HAS NOT SEEN AND EAR HAS NOT HEARD, AND WHICH HAVE NOT ENTERED THE HEART OF MAN, ALL THAT GOD HAS PREPARED FOR THOSE WHO LOVE HIM." —I Corinthians 2:6-9

Remember the former things long past, For I am God, and there is no other; I am God, and there is no one like Me, Declaring the end from the beginning, And from ancient times things which have not been done, Saying, 'My purpose will be established, And I will accomplish all My good pleasure' —Isaiah 46:9,10

...to list just a few!

God is not taken back by the wickedness of this world, but had a plan in place before the foundation of the earth to redeem mankind and usher in His kingdom..."Your kingdom come. Your will be done, On earth as it is in heaven." (Mathew 6:10). Sadly enough, many have been so concerned about how to escape the coming days, they are missing their destiny. If you are alive on the earth at this time in history, you are in place to be an Esther, a Daniel, a Joseph, a Moses, Mary the mother of Jesus or any one of the heroes/heroines the Lord has used mightily through the ages. Each of these was in, or went through preparatory seasons, contrary to their destiny,

which was exactly where the Lord had ordained for them to be! They experienced deep, dark valley after valley that could have caused many to despair of life, blaming God for their circumstances and forfeiting their destinies due to unbiblical responses to God's purpose and plan for their lives. The heroes of the faith, however, did not "shrink back" but cooperated with the 'stage' God was setting for their lives—faithfully walking with their God, even when they did not understand. Their faithful obedience allowed God to have His way, putting them in exactly the right place, at the right time, to radically change the world in which they lived.

It's Your Turn!

In case you're thinking that God will never use you for anything GREAT, I want you to know the measure of personal fulfillment you experience through your unquestioning obedience will not be affected by how important your assignment looks to others. When we are walking in humble union with our Lord—no matter how He chooses to use us—we will be completely fulfilled for we will have walked out onto the stage our Father set and ordained for us even while in our mother's womb. If this sounds farfetched to some of you, you may have allowed yourself to drift away from the awe of the loving, all-powerful, miracle working God Who loves each of us just as if we were His only child. Nothing is too difficult for Him, even while working with His imperfect creation.

Richard and I attended the 25th Anniversary of the International Transform Our World Conference last October. The testimonies we heard of what God is doing throughout the world with common people like you and I—substantiated with statistics—were nothing less than amazing and miraculous! Repeatedly, the common denominator was faithful servants with hearts to see the Kingdom of God expressed in their sphere of influence, faithfully living out their daily lives with the expectation that God would answer their prayers and transform the

world around them. When God had them in position, such as a stage set for a Grand Finale, He often asked them to do something beyond their comfort zone, many times very quickly, out of radical obedience. Their obedience pulled back the curtain, catapulting them into God's purpose for this day and hour.

What's In Your Hand?

The key verse we started with at the beginning of this article is found in Exodus 4:2. This verse follows Moses turning aside to see the bush that appeared to be burning but was not consumed. Just after the "burning bush" experience is Exodus 3:6, where Moses hides his face because he is afraid to look at God.

- Some of you may be afraid of intimacy with God because of things that happened to you while growing up. In preparation for the next season in your life, ask God to heal you of the memories and pain. Seek out spirit-led people to pray with you. Others of you may 'hide' from the presence of God because of your past. Let His love wash what is already forgiven from your conscience awareness and get ready to shine!

In verse 8 of the same chapter, God clearly gives Moses the promise of promises. He promises to free His people from the power of the Egyptians and bring them to the "promised land," "the land flowing with milk and honey."

- Many of you have very specific promises from God, in regards to your destiny, which have not yet been fulfilled. If you know that you know there is still life to these promises, be careful not to let the promises of God become stale. Cling to them like a life ring in the midst of a raging sea.

In the rest of Exodus, chapter 3, God makes it very clear to Moses that He will do what He says He will do. God makes a promise to Moses that the elders of Israel will believe the message God is sending him to deliver, that He will deliver His

people with mighty miracles, as well as plundering the Egyptians of their clothing, gold and silver. Yet in the first verse of chapter 4, we see Moses fearful and making excuses for his unbelief.

- Be prepared for your flesh and the enemy to try to talk you out of the promises or dreams the Lord has given you. This is absolutely normal, but you cannot allow doubt to take root in your heart. Be encouraged in the Lord and have a few faithful prayer partners that will stand with you.

Finally, in verse 2 of chapter 4, God asks Moses what is in his hand. Moses had been in the desert for forty years caring for sheep, and was comfortable with the shepherd's staff in his hand. With great patience, God uses the instrument that represented Moses' way of life to do the miraculous that would cause people to believe that the God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob had sent him.

- Know that in the middle of "what you have in your hand," the common everyday activities of life; that which you do for a vocation, a ministry, recreation, just life on this earth, God is not only able but desirous to bring forth the supernatural as an attesting sign of the God you serve!

In testimony after testimony; God brings forth the impossible through prayer, arranges circumstances and brings together people through supernatural means and catapults plain, normal people onto a stage where their destiny can be fulfilled. This is what God is doing in the hour in which we live. He is looking for "those whose heart is completely His" to bring heaven to earth, one touch at a time!

Revival – Six Years in the Making

Just a week before the citywide Carlos Annacondia Ministries' pre-crusade, Pastor Carlos held a powerful event at the new Tierra y Libertad Church site (sponsored by Aerovision of Norton Shores, MI). The timing was close, but Pastor Carlos had booked his close friend, Gamaliel, from his hometown an entire year before for Cristo es el Camino's sixth anniversary.

To celebrate the long-awaited church building at Tierra y Libertad, Pastor Carlos held the anniversary celebration at the site of the new church plant. Gama (as he is usually called) has a church of just over 1,000. He also travels as an evangelist with the gift of healing. We have been blessed to be ministered



to by Gama before and the Spirit of the Lord is upon him.

There were approximately 300 people that attended the revival meeting. Tierra y Libertad is strategically located along the edge of one of the largest, and probably the poorest, squatter areas in Los Cabos. There were praise dances by the women's praise troupe, a praise dance by the large troupe of little girls (who have been watching the women since they were young, waiting for their chance), a powerful drama set to music, passionate praise, powerful preaching, and flooded altar call. I really am not trying to be flowery with my words. Pastor Carlos is blessed with serious, humble, passionate people.

As of this morning, Pastor Carlos was able to report that one person who was prayed for received healing and another with very weak eyes received excellent eyesight, along with several who accepted Christ for the first time and others who asked for the fullness of the Spirit and baptism with fire. We also received a report of a drug and alcohol addict who has not used either since being prayed for, and, best of all, he reports no desire to do so! Only God can deliver like that!



The presence of the Holy Spirit was thick and the night brought back memories to Richard and I of times past when we were blessed to be a part of such a presence of God. The most exciting thing, though, is the change in atmosphere we are beginning to feel in Los Cabos. It is just the beginning!

We are so grateful to all of you who keep us here and are allowing us to be a part of a significant move of God.

Crusade Officially Kicks-Off

Friday, November 13 was officially the kick-off for the 2016 crusade with Carlos Anacondia – Jesus Loves You, Los Cabos! The area pastors and believers were not waiting for the pre-crusade, though. They were gearing up to take their city for Christ long before.

On Monday, November 9, a prayer drive was held. The pastors' acquired the needed permits and then gathered together, behind a police escort, to drive through the city. For more than two hours, nearly 80 cars paraded through the city. The participants prayed, sang, and proclaimed the truth of God's love and transformation as they drove through the city. The prayer drive ended in a park where we all got out and prayed, worshiped, and celebrated God some more. This was not merely hype or advertising. This was warfare! The people came prepared to take the city. They are ready to see what God is going to do. They believe it is time and they are eager to see what He has in store!

That eagerness was evident the Wednesday before the pre-crusade, as well. Richard and I picked up Elias and Leo from the airport in the early afternoon and then we all went to the first training session. The training had been set up in order to train ushers, intercessors, altar workers, etc. for the pre-crusade and then the main crusade in April. While we were expecting approximately 25 pastors to attend, we could not even begin to anticipate the crowd of volunteers they brought with them. There were roughly 230 volunteers in attendance! There were 50 intercessors! The church was packed. Worship was powerful! These believers were not there to put in their service hours. They were there in anticipation and with great expectation as to what God is about to do!



Pre-Crusade a Success!

The pre-crusade was a success! Not only was it an excellent test-run for the main crusade in April, but it was also an excellent beginning for intercession and for preparing the atmosphere for the revival we believe God has in store for Los Cabos!

Elias Annacondia and Leo Castagnari, the event-coordination team, flew into Los Cabos on Wednesday, November 11. They were ready for the worker training event that night at 6:00 p.m.

The next day, the coordination team met with the steering committee to discuss last minute details. The Campaign Steering Committee is made up of ourselves and six of our seasoned pastors. They are veterans at running big, outdoor events. Since our largest church in town only holds around 400 people, most of the churches use area parks for outreaches of any size.

After the meeting, we were asked by Pastor Luis to pray for a lady in his church who had colon cancer in the advanced stages. This sister and her family run one of the popular restaurants in town and the family wanted to honor us with dinner before we prayed. We do not have an up-to-date report on Sister Maria, but we are praying for a good report. During the prayer, Elias took the time to call his father, Carlos Annacondia, and we could hear the familiar voice of his father, coming into the room from the telephone.

Then the big event arrived – on Friday the 13 (we especially liked the choice of date). Committees had been there setting up most of the day and there were others there the day before painting over the graffiti in the stage area. The praise teams start early the day of the event to saturate the area with praise for hours before the meeting. The committees, made up from different churches, looked like they had always worked together. The whole day, from setup to tear down at 10:30 p.m., looked like the army described in the book of Joel, who walk shoulder to shoulder and do not break rank. They and their pastors are amazing!

The event officially started at 6:00 p.m., but warmed up as the night cooled off, as is especially

common in Mexico. If you take pictures at the beginning, you could miss half the crowd! The official count was 826 people present in the immediate park area and we're not really sure if this counted the 250 workers that were spread between the two ministry tents and the boundaries of the main stage area.

Elias was thrilled that he could sense the spiritual hunger of the people and was able to send encouraging reports to headquarters in Argentina, reports that Los Cabos is ready for a Carlos Annacondia Crusade.

The altar was full for probably at least one hour, and that included pastors praying, as well as Elias and Leo. There were over ten testimonies of major healings given at the microphone, as well as many more reports that the Lord had touched them in many different ways. At our post-event meeting the following Wednesday, there was a huge pile of response forms that were quickly distributed to the pastors in the area where the people live, but we don't have a total paper count yet.

The event team cleaned the entire area of 1,000 chairs, power, lights, etc. in just a half hour! When I looked at the time when the event was over, I imagined when we would finally be cleaned up, but again, the troops amazed me.

I do have to share one last tradition that Richard and I have with Elias and Leo. It is always so late when the meetings of any kind are over that we are finally wandering to whatever taqueria is open (which many of them are open until 2:00 or 4:00 a.m.) to feed our guests. The Friday night of the pre-crusade was no different. At least I'm training my digestive system to accept food when it already thinks it is in bed sleeping.

Finally, Elias and Leo invited us to a last minute breakfast on Saturday morning with some of the pastoral leaders from La Paz, in preparation for their pre-crusade, which is scheduled for January of 2016. We then whisked Elias and Leo off to the San Jose del Cabo Airport; finishing off crusade planning and preparation on trip three—until we meet again. Blessings and thanks to all of you who are helping make this happen!

It was a great opportunity for Rick and Nancy to get pictures of the project and be able to relate the excitement surrounding Pastor Carlos Maciel's new church plant.



While here, Nancy Schneider was also able to give a dental hygiene presentation to the children at the Feeding Los Cabos Kids' kitchen, hosted by

Tony and Lupe Hernandez. The kitchen is only one lot over from the church project, with the intention of the church providing spiritual teaching and guidance for the mainly women and children who attend the feeding kitchen.

We again thank Aerovision, Rick and Nancy Cramblet, and Rick and Nancy Schneider for their faithful support of what God is doing in Los Cabos.

Mission House Update

This is an update on the outcome of our house in the old El Arco Trailer Park. I'm including this report since many of you have been standing with us in prayer over this situation.

In the spring of 2013, we had the opportunity to purchase a home (that would have been condemned in the states) in an old trailer park on the outskirts of Cabo San Lucas. Prior to this time, we had been renting in La Playita, which is a small town near San Jose del Cabo, on the N.E. end of the tourist corridor.

Unlike what we would think of as a trailer park, the occupants owned their homes but rented the land from the Ehido, which are Mexican Indians with the legal right to control a large amount of the land in Los Cabos. Through the years, many of the residents had added to their homes until there were several very nice homes in the park.

On Thanksgiving day of 2014, just a little over two months after much of Los Cabos was destroyed by Hurricane Odile, the residents of the park received a letter saying the park was going to be closed and we all had to leave. The older residents of the park had originally been given a letter telling them the money they had put into their homes and property would be reimbursed at the time they were asked to leave. They retained a land lawyer with expertise in dealing with the Ehido, but were told they would have no recourse against the Ehido, let alone receive money for the money they had put in their houses.

Fortunately for us, since we did not have the money to rebuild our home after the hurricane, we were notified of the eviction before putting more money into the house. We were given until December of 2015 to take what we could from the home. We had continued to pray and hope we would be allowed to remain in the house to possibly be the caretakers of the land (necessary to keep squatters off property in Mexico). One day in November, we felt a strong leading from the Lord to go to the Ehido land office that day and ask for permission to stay, especially since we do a lot of work in the barrios

for the poorest of the Mexican people. When we arrived, the main Ehido officials were seated in the waiting room of the office. We told them why we were there and asked for permission. Part of the men present did at least listen to us and one also took our business card. However, in a short period of time, the President of the group declared we would have to be off the land by December 31 as originally stated.

Earlier in the year, we were given the opportunity to rent a condo from a lady who attended Cabo Church with us—in lieu of continuing to live in our 20-foot round guest room that survived the hurricane. We had continued to live in the park in this room for the seven months after the hurricane. We are very thankful for the lovely condo to live in, but we have no office space, storage, garage or workshop.

For a little over a month, we moved everything into the condo, a storage unit and two covered trailers. Pastor Carlos Maciel came daily with a crew of his men for several weeks. They were able to remove all of the beams that originally supported the roof. Pastor Carlos had them chip up all of the tiles from the floor of the living level, remove windows, doors and the supporting beams of the garage roof, plus much, much, more. Most of the materials will be used in the Tierra y Libertad Church building project and some will be used for other housing projects. We can't thank Pastor Carlos and his faithful men enough for easing our pain by being able to salvage much of the materials in the house.

For those of you who knew the story, we want to express our gratitude for your standing with us in prayer. It didn't turn out like we thought it might have, but of course we know God always knows what He is doing, even when we may not know. We will continue to go on step-by-step as He unfolds His provision for our present needs of office space, a work shop area, as well as storage. We know that exciting days are ahead of us!

Pastor Verne and Sheryl Ann Wright

Richard and I began to think of the many ways that Pastor Verne and Sheryl Ann have affected our lives. Then I realized I needed to “give honor to whom honor is due,” and share just a few highlights of their part in several significant events in our lives.

We first met Pastor Verne when friends of ours invited us to his evening service on Mother's Day of 1987. Richard and I had been studying the Bible in regards to the gifts of the Spirit, but weren't ready to attend a Pentecostal or charismatic church. On the drive to the service, I told the Lord I really did not understand how the gifts of the Spirit were to operate in my life, but I did invite Him to teach me.

That night, Pastor Verne had a gift of the Word of Knowledge for a person with lower back pain. At that time, I was going to a chiropractor, up to twice a week, but they could not keep my curved spine in alignment. Pastor Verne invited the person with the lower back pain to come to the front for prayer. The thought of going forward for prayer in the middle of a service was completely foreign to me, so I didn't go forward. Pastor Verne knew it was me, so after the service he again asked that the person with the lower back pain come forward. I went forward and Pastor Verne had Sheryl Ann and her mother pray for my back. I was sitting firmly in a chair when the Lord straightened the curve in my spine, causing my hip to shoot out forward, even as I was seated.

Up to this time, I had experienced supernatural healing for my daughters and much supernatural provision from the Lord, but this was my first experience of being healed from a Word of Knowledge and prayer in a church service. Pastor Verne then asked Richard and I if we had ever received the gift of the Holy Spirit. Like I said earlier, we had been studying and praying about it, so we let Pastor Verne pray for us and we both received the baptism of the Holy Spirit that night.

When Richard was working in industrial maintenance, he was on second shift for two years. This was during the time when we had The

Blue House, a halfway house for drug and alcohol rehabilitation. I would often take one of the young men to Shiloh on Wednesday nights to be prayed for. At that time, I had endometriosis, recurring cysts on my ovaries, a tipped uterus and extremely painful PMS. My doctor suggested that I have a hysterectomy, but at my age at the time, I wasn't sure I wanted a hysterectomy. Three days before the incident I am going to relate, I had asked the Lord to please heal me because I was in great pain for three out of four weeks each month. As was my custom, I brought one of the young men from the Blue House to the Wednesday night service at Shiloh. Pastor Verne again had a word of knowledge and told me from the platform, "Rhonda, I know you brought your friend to be prayed for but the Lord wants to do something for you." I quickly went up and told him I needed all new female organs. He called the elders of the church together and they prayed for me. This particular healing wasn't instantaneous, but the pain lessened each day and within three days I was pain free with only normal monthly symptoms from that time on.

We finally started attending Shiloh in 1992, and shortly after that Sheryl Ann invited me to a woman's retreat. The Holy Spirit nudged me to go. The keynote speaker was Pastor Anne Jimenez, who co-pastored with her husband, and is a highly respected preacher. That night, the Lord sent fear into my heart as He told me that I would be doing what she was doing. That was my call to pulpit ministry—the furthest thing from my mind. The next day, during worship, Pastor Verne confirmed the call.

When we started attending Shiloh Tabernacle, Richard and I had been ministering in the local prisons and were honored to have a state-recognized prison ministry. Pastor Verne and those at Shiloh supported us with this vision, including becoming very involved themselves. During this time, there was an opening for a prison chaplain at one of the facilities in Muskegon. To be a prison chaplain, you had to be a licensed minister, so Pastor Verne honored us by licensing us as ministers through Shiloh Tabernacle, under Calvary Ministries International.

During this time, Shiloh Tabernacle had a television ministry and Sheryl Ann encouraged me to do a weekly show teaching the truths of the crucified life and victorious Christian living through the power of the cross. This season in my life was a great joy for me and my times of preparation for the show were special times with the Lord. Just during our time at home in Muskegon for the holidays, one lady who had always been touched by "Rhonda from the Heart," told me how much it meant to her and how much she missed it—what a precious reunion that was! From this beginning, I was encouraged by several friends to go on the "Ask the Pastor" show on TCT for almost 20 years. Thank-you, Sheryl Ann!

Richard and I learned hands-on, spirit-led prayer at Shiloh Tabernacle. One of Pastor Verne's greatest skills is moving people beyond being spectators or beyond being prayed for, to praying for people and moving in the gifts of the Spirit themselves. The Spirit of God moved so heavily, we would be ministering to people up to an hour or more after the morning service. During this time, we received impartation and invaluable training in the use of the gifts of the Spirit.

The time came when Richard and I felt led to begin a church in nearby Holton, Michigan and Pastor Verne blessed us, and prayed over us as he sent us out. That was almost 20 years ago now, but Pastor Verne and Sheryl Ann have remained faithful friends and supporters.

This is really just the highlights of the faithful, fruitful ministry of Pastor Verne and Sheryl Ann Wright in our lives. We thank God for them, ask His blessing upon them, and pray that this year Shiloh will have a visitation of the Spirit greater than at any other time.
